It is now that time of the year when b-schools will be commencing their admission process for the next academic year. The number of applicants for conventional MBA programmes is fast declining. We do not know as yet any new higher education policy initiatives from the central government. But, in our own interest, we need to differentiate

ourselves and offer a distinct 'value proposition' to the prospective students.

An important and interesting tool for pushing through one's fears and other negative emotions is the positive affirmation. Affirmations are uplifting and soothing thoughts that tends to keep oneself in an upbeat, loving state. When you find yourself fearful or upset about any situation in life, you can simply begin repeating an appropriate affirmation over and over again until peace envelopes you like a warm blanket.

An affirmation is an encapsulation of a whole wealth of lifeaffirming thoughts that remind us that we are inherently powerful and loving and there is nothing to fear. (Jeffers, 2006)

For example, a very useful affirmation could be 'It's all happening Perfectly!'.

One may wonder, how can all things go perfect, when a lot of things don't turn out the way we want them to turn out. And when we explore the deep, deep meaning of this affirmation, we find the answer. It's all happening Perfectly! is a shortened version of...

'My mind cannot see the larger picture, the Grand Design. I don't know why life is happening the way it is, but I will simply trust that all things happen for a reason. Therefore, even if a certain situation is not going the way I want it to go, I will relax and focus on how I can learn and grow from it all. In this way, I become a stronger and more loving person. Yes ... It's all happening Perfectly!

Similarly, one can take up any number of appropriate affirmations, that would aid in leading your work and life peaceful, active, alert, healthy, conscious, confident, courageous, wise and how you wish it to be. Make sure you frame your affirmations on a positive note rather than double negatives. For eg., if you would want to frame, 'I will not be afraid of new experiences', it is always better to frame the same as 'I will enjoy new experiences' or 'I will embrace newness in life'. This is very important.

It is also surprising to note that just saying, thinking or writing positive thoughts make us stronger in every way whether we believe the words or not. One can say affirmations whenever you find time, be it while in travel, while waiting for someone, while going to bed, while waking up and whenever you find yourself free. Few more affirmations that are helpful in life includes

- My life makes a difference.
- Whatever happens, I'll handle it!
- I focus on my many blessings.
- I let go and I trust.
- All is well.
- I am drawing to me all good things.
- The quality of my life depends only on me.
- I reach out and invite others into my life.
- I love and approve myself.
- I am healthy, safe, peaceful and cheerful.

Affirmations are found to be really working as they are actually positive reinforcements that aid one's mind to focus on one's strengths, growth and maturity.

Let us Understand Anchoring Bias

When we are trying to make a decision, we often use an anchor or focal point as a reference or starting point. Psychologists have found that people have a tendency to rely too heavily on the very first piece of information they learn, which can have a great impact on the decision they end up making. This type of cognitive bias is known as the anchoring bias or anchoring effect. According to Amos Tversky and Daniel Kahneman, people make estimates by starting from an initial value that is adjusted to yield the final answer. The initial value, or starting point, may be suggested by the formulation of the problem, or it may be the result of a partial computation. In both the cases, adjustments are typically insufficient. That is, different starting points yield different estimates, which are biased toward the initial values.

The anchoring bias can influence how much you are willing to pay. For example, imagine that you are buying a new car. You learn from the internet that the average price of the vehicle you are interested in is 2.5 lakh rupees. When you are shopping at the used car market, the dealer offers you the same vehicle for 2.25 lakh. You may quickly accept because the price is less than what you were expecting to pay. Later, you might scold yourself for making such a quick decision and not shopping around for a better deal. So why did you jump so quickly on that first offer? The anchoring bias suggests that we favour the first bit of information we learn. Since your initial research indicated that 2.5 lakh was the average price, the first offer you encountered seemed like a great deal. You failed to notice the possibility that other dealers might have lower prices, and made a decision on the information you already had, which served as an anchoring point in your mind.
