





The term 'intrapreneurship' was coined by Gifford Pinchot III in 1978. According to him, intrapreneurs are "dreamers who take hands-on responsibility for creating innovations of any kind, within a business". By applying the social lens, motivated employees within organizations can utilize the benefits of business to make the world a better place. This leads us to the theme 'social intrapreneurship', which refers to 'doing social good' by operating within existing organizations. Though businesses are primarily driven by profits and growth, making responsible contribution to social changes is gaining traction nowadays.

Social intrapreneurship involves entrepreneurial activities in large organizations that merge social impact with commercial growth. Many organizations are embracing social intrapreneurship to achieve sustainability and societal development. Such initiatives can benefit organizations by enabling sustainability, innovation, talent management, greater employee motivation and enhanced reputation. Social intrapreneurs are a breed of ambitious employees, at all levels in organizations, who develop and implement innovations that can address social and environmental challenges, while adding commercial value to their parent organizations. These changemakers, supported by their employers, leverage the existing capabilities and infrastructure to create social impact on a large scale.

In times of crisis, such that of pandemic we are facing currently, the need for these champions is felt stronger as the situation provides opportunities for them to demonstrate how innovatively they can contribute to the societies in which they exist. According to 2019 Edelman Trust Barometer, about 75 % of the respondents expect their employers to do the 'right things' when it comes to important social issues. With a growing sense of civic responsibility among the youngsters, organizations need to wake up to the call of duty by encouraging the motivated internal Samaritans to serve the societies in which they operate. According to the World Economic Forum, over 40 global players have come forward to contribute to social cause in the wake of prevailing pandemic.

The major challenges associated with social intrapreneurship include lack of management support, poor organizational climate, stakeholder distrust, and other limiting forces in the external environment. Progressive companies can create positive ecosystem to support social intrapreneurs with autonomy, access to funding, internal networking and collaboration support, opportunities to work on projects with social relevance and build capabilities. Many organizations, through their CSR initiatives, are internally

promoting social intrapreneurship. Social value created through social intrapreneurship benefit various stakeholder groups, driving socio-economic benefits and transformations in the communities they serve. Investing in social intrapreneurship is one of the best strategies for companies, even after the pandemic comes to an end, as it creates both economic and social value in the long run.
